

Phone Scams Involving Social Security

Social Security scams are on the rise, according to the Social Security Administration (SSA).

How This Scam Usually Works: The scammer will call you claiming that there is some problem with your Social Security benefits or that you need to confirm your Social Security number to keep your account active. The crook may even threaten you with arrest or try to entice you with a promise of increased benefits if you set up a payment immediately via credit card or some other method.

Keep in mind, the SSA *may* call you, but a legitimate agent will never threaten you or demand payment. Here's what it says on <u>SSA.gov</u>: "If there is a problem with your Social Security number or record, we will typically mail you a letter." The agency says generally it will call you if:

- You have recently applied for a Social Security benefit.
- Are currently receiving payments and need to update your record.
- Have specifically requested a phone call from them.

LEFT OVER PUMPKINS? WHAT DO I DO?

Here's some cool ideas!

Pumpkins are a great source of nitrogen for compost bins! If you do not keep a compost pile, bury the pumpkin in your yard. As it decays, nutrients and vitamins will enrich your soil, including vitamins A, C, and potassium.

Here is a simple way to guarantee you will have pumpkins for next fall. Place the dry seeds in a sealed envelope and keep them in a cool and dry place where they can stay undisturbed for a long period of time (your refrigerator is perfect for this). Next spring, you can plant the seeds in your garden for fresh orange pumpkins by fall.

A seed bomb is a little ball made up of a combination of compost, clay, and seeds. The compost and clay act as a carrier for the seeds so they can be easily planted. Interestingly enough, the seeds you save may not be the same type of pumpkin that will eventually grow, due to the fact that pumpkins hybridize themselves while growing near other varieties. It's an adventure because you don't know what you're going to get, and that's the fun of it. There are more than 45 different varieties of pumpkins, all in different sizes, shapes, and colors.

LAYERED PUMPKIN DELIGHT



- 1 cup all-purpose flour
- ½ cup butter, softened
- ³/₄ cup chopped pecans
- 8 ounces cream cheese, softened
- 1 cup powdered sugar
- 3 cups whipped topping, divided
- 2½ cups milk
- 3 (3.4- ounce) packages white chocolate (or vanilla) instant pudding mix
- 1 (15-ounce) can pumpkin puree
- 1 teaspoon pumpkin spice


LAYER 1 Mix flour, butter, and ½ cup pecans. Press into a greased 9x9 pan. Bake for 15 minutes at 350°F, then remove and let cool.

LAYER 2 Blend cream cheese and powdered sugar, add 1 cup of the whipped topping, then spread over cooled crust.

LAYER 3 Mix milk, pudding mix, canned pumpkin, pumpkin spice, and 1 cup whipped topping, then spread over layer 2.

LAYER 4 Spread remaining 1 cup of whipped topping and sprinkle with pecans. Let chill for 3 hours or until set. Serve chilled.

NOTE: If you are using a 9x13 pan, or would like a thicker crust, add an additional $\frac{1}{2}$ cup flour, $\frac{1}{4}$ cup butter, and $\frac{1}{4}$ cup chopped pecans.
